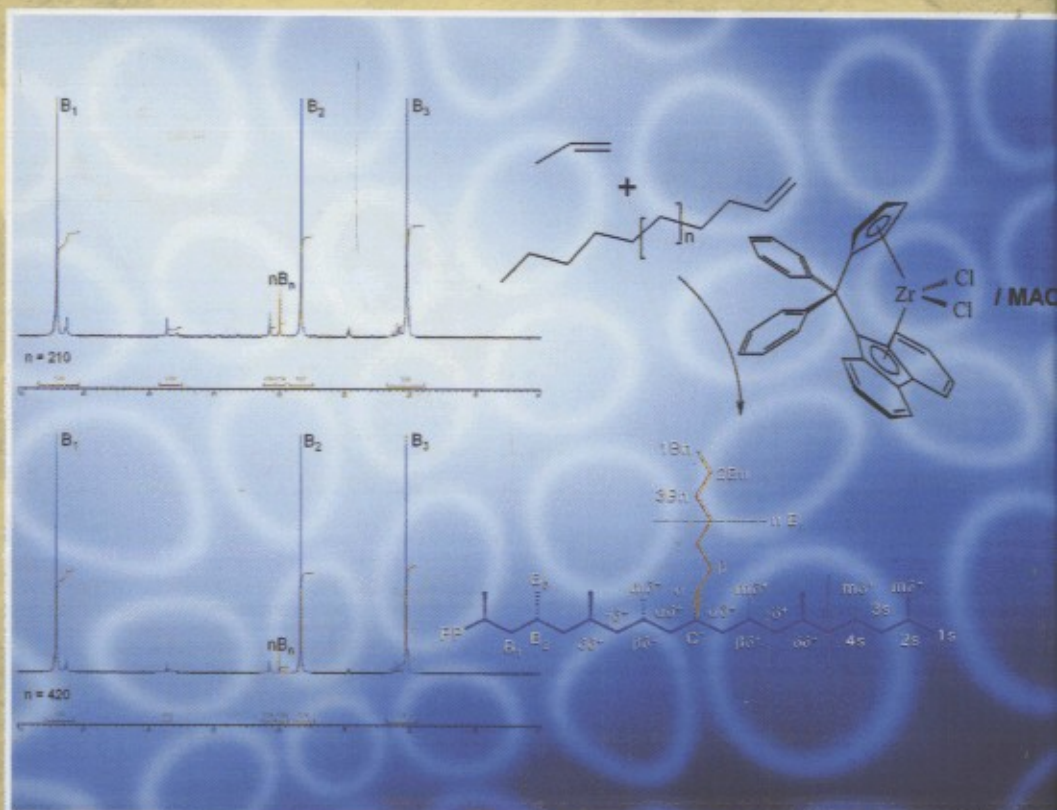

# Macromolecular Symposia

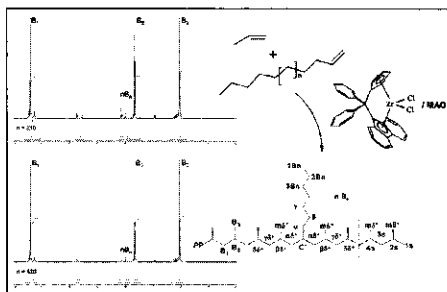
